I was lucky enough to go back to camp in the second-year program as a Paradigm Shifter (PS). Instead of having dialogue once a day, I had it three times a day, two hours at a time. This is code for, being a PS was a lot more intense working! One big difference that I noticed in comparing my two camp experiences was that the first year, dialogue was more focused on your daily community environments and how to go about making it a better, more respectful and peaceful place. As a PS, dialogues were much more focused on who we were as individuals and really delving into what we want our lives and inner selves to look like, which I found much more difficult. In going through my PS experience, I did build deep relationships in a way that was easier and more profound than I'd ever experienced. My very best friend, I've known since this August, and she has helped me figure out what kind of person I want to be, because she gets it. Seeds of Peace creates a special bond within the Seeds family that branches out even after you leave the camp. We participate in various things after camp that incorporate tackling

the issues we see in our communities and we help one another when doing so.

I truly wish every single person on this planet could go to Seeds of Peace, because I believe so strongly in the process one undergoes during those 2 weeks. It's important to remember that everyone has their own experience at camp, and in life, and everyone is an expert in their own experience.




